The wellbeing award

- Is a national award developed by the National Children's Bureau in partnership with Optimus Education.
- Puts the wellbeing and positive mental health of staff and pupils first
- Promotes and encourages the shared vision that emotional wellbeing and positive mental health is the responsibility of all

Why do we want to achieve this award?

We want to achieve this award because:

- The emotional wellbeing of staff and pupils is just as important as their physical health.
- Because good mental health allows children and young people to develop the resilience to cope with whatever life throws at them and grow into well-rounded, healthy adults
- It will help us to recognise what we do well and to identify what we want to do better to support both pupils and staff
- It will enable all members of the school community to be involved and to benefit.

How do we achieve the award?

We need to show progress towards these eight main objectives:

- The school is committed to promoting and protecting emotional well-being and mental health by Achieving the Well Being Award for schools.
- The school has a clear vision and strategy for promoting and protecting emotional well- being and mental health which is communicated to all involved in the school.
- The school has a positive culture which regards mental health as the responsibility of all.
- The school actively promotes staff well-being and mental health.
- The school prioritises professionals learning and staff development on emotional well-being and mental health. The school understands the different types of mental health needs across the school and has a system in place to respond appropriately.
- The school actively seeks the ongoing participation of the whole school community in its approach to emotional well-being and mental health.
- The school works in partnership with other schools, agencies and available specialist services to support emotional well-being and mental health.

Who will help us meet these objectives?

- consist of parents, staff, and governors
- gather and review information from all groups
- use research, good practise and feedback to develop an action plan
- share, implement and review the action plan
- apply for the award
