Black History Month

Throughout the year, there are months that celebrate the history (past) of different groups of people. The history of different groups of people is part of all history so we should learn about everyone's history all year round. However, these specific months help people learn more about groups of people, their history and their importance to the wider world. Black History Month is celebrated each year in October. It is a chance to celebrate the **achievements** of Black people in the past and present. It is celebrated in schools, museums, universities and lots of other places. People learn about important Black people and the impact they have had on **society**.

How Did Black History Month Start?

In 1875, Carter G Woodson was born in the USA. Because of the racism he experienced, Carter didn't have many opportunities to have an education or a well-paid job. However, he eventually managed to go to one of the top universities in the USA.

He noticed that there was almost no mention of Black people in history books and wanted to change this. In 1926, he announced the first ever Black History Month. Carter became known as the 'Father of Black History'.



Olaudah Equiano lived in Britain over 200 years ago. He had been an **enslaved person**. He wrote a book about how unfairly Black people were treated and called for the end of enslavement.



Harriet Tubman was born in the USA around 200 years ago. She was an enslaved person but eventually managed to escape. Harriet helped many other people escape too.







Tessa Sanderson is a British athlete who took part in six Olympic Games. She won a gold medal at the 1984 Olympics.
